














Why is the CoR helping Libyan cities?

Libyan municipalities and their mayors bear most of the responsibility for providing basic services in Libya. Stability and prosperity in Libya is fundamental to the whole Euro-Mediterranean region, and beyond.

With Libyan municipalities, European cities and regions can establish new partnerships for sustainable territorial development.

City diplomacy can also help foster dialogue and combat radicalisation, starting with the youngest generations.



What is the Nicosia Initiative?

The Nicosia Initiative is the European Committee of the Region's capacity-building project aimed at strengthening Libyan local authorities. With the financial support of the Public Administration Facility, it matches the needs of Libyan municipalities with support available from European cities and regions. It aims to improve the living conditions of Libyan citizens, by strengthening public services and administrative capacity at the local level.

The Nicosia Initiative is an example of city diplomacy, bringing together eight Libyan municipalities from all parts of the country and across conflict lines:

- West: Tripoli, Gharyan, Zintan, Zliten
- Centre: Sirte
- South: Sebha
- East: Benghazi, Tobruk



Some achievements to date

Since the launch of the Nicosia Initiative in 2016, 19 study visits and training activities benefiting over 150 representatives of Libyan municipalities have been implemented.

Examples

Sustainable fisheries: In February 2018, the Italian region of Friuli Venezia Giulia and the mayors of Tripoli and Benghazi launched an 18-month training programme for experts, officials and fishermen. The Italian government is the funder.

Peacebuilding training: 180 young Libyans from across the country are taking part in March and April 2018 in an initiative implemented by UNICEF and the Institute for Economics and Peace.
